- Governed by the school council association

PAC

- Fund-raising
- Often have similar positions and roles
- Usually have a goal that is set at the beginning of the year to work through.

### 5. School Report:

- a. Introduction to Chan, Twila and Colleen
- b. Staffing: Sitting at 45 staff, hiring 2 very soon, hoping for up to 5 more depending on funding.
- c. Enrolment: currently 493
- d. Start-up has been very smooth this year
- e. Added an academic counselor to the roster to help guide students through courses and the beginning of career planning.
- f. Teaching and Learning:

- i. Subscribed to IXL this year this will provide real-time data about students' skills in math and literacy
- ii. Report cards are online this year. Parents can choose paper copy via verification form.
- g. Positive Behavior Support (PBS) for each of the meetings in the future, we will have data and information about the tickets that are being handed out.
- h. School Education Plan Two main goal priorities for this year again:
  - i. Mental Health and Wellness
  - ii. Numeracy competencies
- i. Around the school activities:
  - i. Karaoke at lunch
  - ii. Robotics club at lunch
  - iii. Grade 9 planning team (look at planning events like overnight trips and dances) brief explanation about suspensions and participation.
- j. Wellness Room Wellness EA
- k. Culture Club Run by our JP Student Advocacy Councellor
- I. Winter Showcase- Dec 19th, and 20th Production is called "No Body to Murder".
- 6. **Budget** we have \$140,000 in the bank to spend; went over budget report and line items.

# 7. Discussion Item: Board Policy #17 & CTF Fees

- a. Background: The board strongly believes that the school should not charge fees.
- b. Our Fees:
  - i. \$25 student activity fee (goes to student council to fund activities)
  - ii. \$25 for <u>each of the CTS courses</u>
    - Outdoor Ed
    - Fine Arts and Theatre
    - Home Ec
    - Shop

Covers consumables and travel for the program.

- c. Important to remember that not all families pay the fee
- d. There is not a consequence for non-payment, but there is incentive for early payment.
- e. Options for families that can't afford it?
- f. Discussion about advertising the amounts and the payment plans available
  - i. Partnerships
  - ii. Payment plans
  - iii. Multiple push-outs
  - iv. Parent-teacher interviews
  - v. Sending notifications through school messenger
  - vi. Would we have more completion if we separated the fees so it's 4 \$25 fees rather than a \$100 one?

<u>Motion</u>: Dawn moved to use \$100 of PAC money to run an incentive program for school fee payment. Those who have paid fees by October 31 will have their names entered for a draw for a \$100 gift card for a local store of their choice.
